

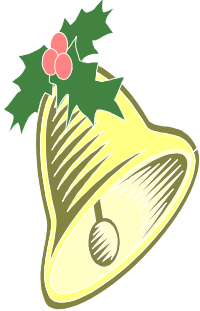

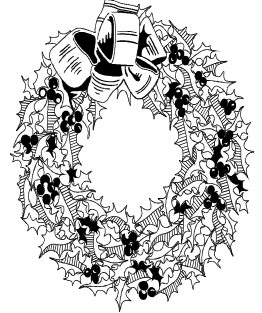

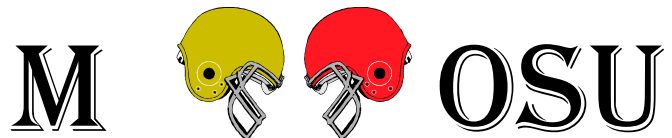

### IN REMEMBRANCE

A dear friend to many of us, Brother and Sir Knight Stanley F. Paputa, PFN passed away on September 21, 2009 after a long illness. Stanley joined Holy Cross Council in November of 1953 and was very active in many of the council functions and activities. In February of 1956 he became a Sir Knight of Detroit #305 Assembly. He immediately became involved and joined the Honor Guard. While at #305, showing his dedication to the Color Corp, he was appointed as a Lieutenant Commander stepping out for many of our Founder’s Day Masses and Family Corporate Communion. When Holy Cross was presented a charter for an Assembly in early 1973, Sir Knight Paputa was elected as the first Faithful Captain of Holy Cross Assembly #1622. He was also appointed as the first Worthy Commander of the new Honor Guard of our Assembly.

Over the years he chaired/co-chaired many dances the fourth degree sponsored, helped out at many festival booths at the old Hart Plaza – polish festivals and was always involved in the early years of our Poor Man’s New Years Eve party. In the late 70s and early 80s, he was a co-chairman of our Tuesday bingos. On Friday nights, when we had our bowling leagues he took part on the team sponsored by the assembly.

In June of 1976, he was nominated and elected as the Faithful Navigator for our assembly. He served as such through the fiscal year ending in the summer of 1978. One great achievement that he accomplished was that during his tenure as an officer, other than these two years as Navigator, he was the Faithful Captain through the 2004-2005 fiscal year. That means he was an officer of the Assembly for 32 consecutive years. As the Worthy Commander he served for 29 consecutive years!

One of the highlights that Sir Knight Stanley was proud of was when he would attend the state convention and take part in the “Living Rosary” with members of other Honor Guardsmen from throughout the state. It was always one of his proudest moments representing Holy Cross.

The Council and Assembly wish to extend deepest sympathy to his wife, Frances and family. He will be sadly missed, but will be remembered by all for a very long time.

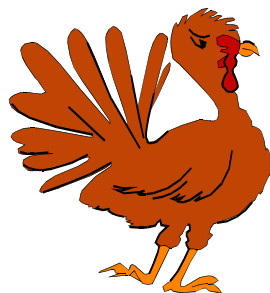
