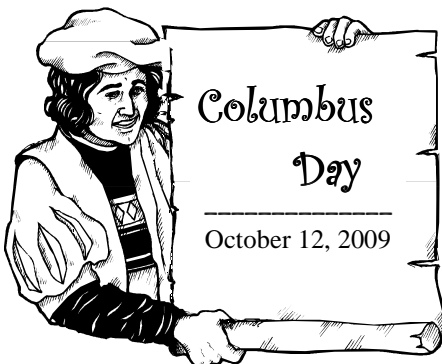

While many of us now live outside of the neighborhood, we still retain our membership to Holy Cross. It's time we recognize this, and finally give back to the neighborhood that gave us so much over the last seventy-five plus years.

Matt and I cannot do this alone. Our District Deputy/Grand Knight has voiced the same concern at several recent meetings, and has pledged his unconditional support to this project. 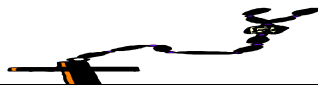
