

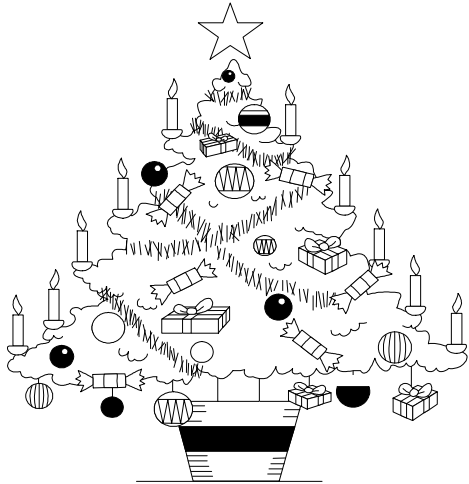

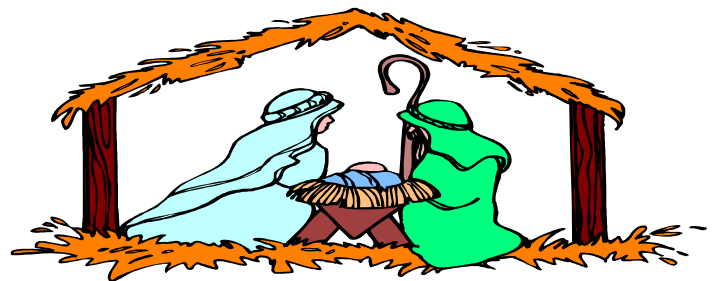

AN IDEA FROM OUR LECTURER

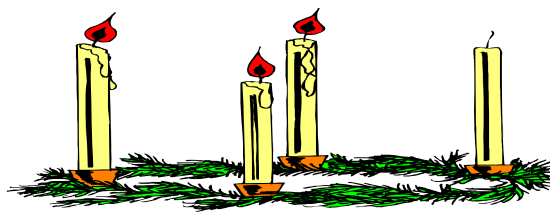
Here's an idea for those of you Brother Knights who are having difficulty paying your dues or those of you who may want to join the fourth degree!

In addition to making payment, you would also be helping the council in one of our recent dire needs - BINGO WORKERS! We sponsor bingos three days a week; Wednesday afternoons, Thursday evenings and Friday afternoons. The state rules that we pay a worker \$15 per session. It wouldn't take you long to accumulate the monies to pay this fee.

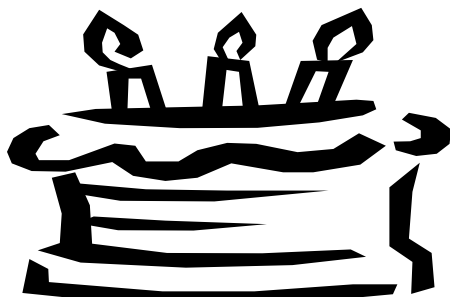

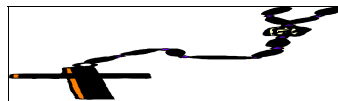
