SQUIRES CELEBRATE 56TH YEAR ANNIVERSARY

On Saturday, April 30, Fr. Daniel A Lord Circle #801 held its 56th Anniversary Banquet and Squire Reunion. The circle had been planning this evening for months, and so much time and care was put into this celebration from so many people!

There were nearly 70 guests in attendance, including State Secretary Michael Malinowski and wife Maureen, District Deputy Michael Kozakiewicz, State Notary Squire Brendan Olech, and many more. As guests walked through the door, they were greeted by Past Circle Chief Squire & Counsellor Jim Vote, and current Notary and Bursar Squires Alex Carrillo and Nick Gachowski, respectively, who checked everyone in and ushered them to their tables. Tables were decorated with blue, red, and yellow balloons and centerpieces--the colors of both the Knights of Columbus and Columbian Squires emblems--and included the evening programs, "champagne glasses," sparkling cider, and rosaries for each attendee.

Mass began at 6:30pm and was offered by Circle #801 Father Prior, Fr. Ken Mazur PIME. #801's candidate, Ben Solis, was the altar server and Chief Squire Sebastian Cooper gave the First Reading. The Responsorial Psalm was read by Alex Carrillo, and the Second Reading was given by Deputy Chief Squire Brian Vincent. Fr. Ken discussed the traditional belief of how we are all considered to be the Apostle Thomas' (also known as Didymus, meaning "twin") twin. His stirring homily captivated everyone.

After mass, a toast was given by Chief Counsellor Bruce Hopkins thanking everyone for their support and to 56 more years! Tables were dismissed one-by-one for a buffet style dinner, catered by Brother Knight James J. Vote. The menu consisted of Jack Daniels glazed turkey breast, roast pork loin with apple-berry chutney, Italian sausage with penne pasta, roasted parsley potatoes, honey glazed carrots, a tossed salad, dinner rolls, and a specially designed anniversary sheet cake. Compliments to the chef! Everyone raved about how great the food was!

Shortly following the cake slicing and serving, the Master of Ceremonies for the banquet, Sebastian Cooper (#801 Chief Squire and State Deputy Chief Squire) spoke eloquently of Brother Barnabas MacDonald, the founder of the Columbian Squires, and his vision for young Catholic men to grow into strong leaders of the faith. He welcomed all of our dignitaries and guests, and detailed the importance of recognizing our circle's rich history by thanking those who paved the way for our successes now and in the future. Sebastian then explained the four program areas of the Columbian Squires; Service, Membership, Spiritual, and Circle, and introduced four circle officers to tell everyone about what we've done this year.

Brian Vincent, DCS discussed Service, Alex Carrillo, NS discussed Membership, Aaron Serda, SS discussed Spiritual, and Andrew Vincent, MS discussed Circle, and all of them listed various activities we performed together in each area, followed by their favorite memories as squires thus far.

Our Emcee introduced Ray Bilyk FSD, PSNS and Nick Gachowski BS to reveal our new History Wall. They talked about how important it is to remember why we are here today, and who came before us to do the Lord's work in the Circle. On the History Wall is the Circle's Chief Squire, Chief Counselor, and Father Prior history, as well as recognition of the "big three" awards won and in what years (Brother Barnabas, Corps d'Elite, and Star Circle), and a "Legends" list; a list of squires and knights who have served at the highest levels on the Michigan Columbian Squires State Board. Being added soon to the wall is a Hall of Fame and Squire of the Year list. It is an incredible sight, and any supporter of the Squires ought to come down to the council and take a look at it and the circle meeting room.

Sebastian then introduced Counsellor Sean Roland PSCS and Aaron Serda to thank various persons who have given their time and helped the circle this year: Mark Kopyy FN for advertising at local churches for carwashes and membership blitzes; Dave Micklash GK for continuing to sponsor the circle and providing us with fundraising opportunities; Darryl Troczynski FS for the research into our circle's history; =====>

Jennifer Bilyk for gathering donations and decorating the baskets for the raffle at Poor Man's NYE; Mike Kozakiewicz, DD for having our backs and putting so much time, devotion and love into the continued efforts of the circle; and Kelley Formolo, who worked in the kitchen, sold tickets, and also assembled baskets for the raffle. All were presented with framed Certificates of Appreciation given by the circle. Mike Kozakiewicz was presented with gift certificates for a ferry and carriage ride in Mackinac, and Kelley was presented with a bouquet of flowers. The squires went off script too, and surprised their Chief Counsellor with a gift bag to show their appreciation for him.

Following the thank you's was a jacket dedication, made by Matthew Dziewit FSD. In the early 80s, Chief Counsellor Richard Klein had jackets made for the squires and the friends of the circle. SK Wes Troczynski was one of those friends of the circle, and he recently donated his jacket back to #801. We immediately decided it should be framed and enshrined and hung on our meeting room wall as a symbol of those friends of the circle who always loved to see the squires grow in their faith and serve the community. Sir Knights Wes Troczynski and Ray Robak are two of those friends and the circle dedicated the jacket to them.

Sebastian then welcomed Jim Vote PSCS and Mike Kozakiewicz DD to the podium for our one-of-a-kind Circle #801 Hall of Fame induction ceremony. We wanted to recognize individuals who have made significant contributions to Circle #801 and have gone far and beyond the need to do so. The 2011 class of inductees are: Marion Bilyk, Marty Robak, Wes Troczynski, and Joe Dziewit. These individuals have put so many hours and donations and miles (on the cars) for the squires and they deserve to be immortalized on our walls and in our hearts forever.

After the Hall of Fame Induction, State Secretary Mike Malinowski spoke about a few memories he had of the squires, and gave a ringing endorsement of the job well done by Sebastian Cooper and Circle #801 for the tremendous banquet put on that evening. He said he has no concerns at all about the future of the Michigan Columbian Squires after the experience he had at our wonderfully executed event.

Chief Counsellor Bruce Hopkins gave an emotional speech about the unmatched, superb work the #801 counsellors all do, and cited the example of three brothers--all of whom were squires--that left the program before turning 18 because they seemed to lose interest. Their mother approached him recently and told him they were all going to college, and that she didn't think at one point that they were going to make it, given the rough environment they lived in. She said the counsellors changed their outlook, and made it possible for them to believe they could do it, and she thanked the counsellors for everything they did. Bruce mentioned how proud this makes the counsellors, and segued into how proud their selection for Squire of the Year makes them as well. Brian Vincent was awarded Squire of the Year for his outstanding efforts in the circle, at home, at school, and at church. He is a well-rounded young man and is a great example for other squires and candidates to follow.

Finally, Sebastian welcomed Fr. Ken to deliver his summation but to Fr. Ken's surprise, he was halted from speaking for just a few moments for a special thank you to him on behalf of the entire circle. Fr. Ken was presented with a framed Certificate of Appreciation specifically printed for outstanding Father Priors, a "Sidney Crosby Cry Baby" t-shirt, a \$200 gift certificate to play paintball (yes, he wants to play paintball), and a custom, white satin stole with the Columbian Squires emblem and "801 D" embroidered on it. After his words of wisdom, Sebastian closed out the evening and thanked everyone for coming.

We would love to do this again next year. If you missed this evening, you missed the greatest example of unity, support, teamwork, and Columbianism in the Order. Fr. Daniel A Lord Circle #801 thanks you all, and we look forward to many more years of excellence.

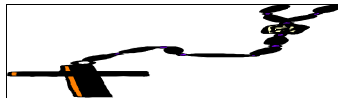
